Dear Families and Partners,

Over the past year at Morning Star Boys' Ranch, we have seen growth, expansion, and improvements that vastly outpace what we expected as 2019 began. Now, nationally accredited with the Council on Accreditation (COA), implementing clinical therapeutic treatment practices for residents, and with the H.O.P.E. project well underway and set to finish this Spring, Morning Star is preparing for a new season of exciting change!

When I started at Morning Star Boys' Ranch last January, I found a wealth of staff who are committed to the boys and the Mission, Vision, and Values the Ranch set forth. There are also hundreds of stakeholders – including teachers and staff in District 81 schools, social workers, foster parents, medical personnel, and mission supporters – who have partnered with us to work with and for the boys. It's encouraging to see an entire community come together for the healing, growth, and empowerment of children and families.

In July of 2019 we achieved accreditation with the Council on Accreditation. COA raises the standards of organizations all over the United States, including those of residential facilities like ours. We are extremely proud of the way our team members have stepped up to commit to an even higher level of care for our residents. One way we ensure the quality of care is to meet regularly with our Performance and Quality Improvement team. The team consists of department heads and key staff who are integral to the implementation of policy standards that guide us in providing the residents in our care with quality, evidence-based practices.

It is critical to provide our children and families with the help they need. This includes therapy, a safe living environ-

ment, and structured educational and social programs. In fact, all three are vital to the boys' growth and development and gives them hope for their futures. Each one of our children is precious, and we have been entrusted with their care. I don't take that lightly. That's why treatment plans, progress reports, and case management reviews are implemented into daily care. It's why we've raised our standards, and why we are developing even better programs for kids and families.

The H.O.P.E. project has continued to move forward with fervor. It seems that with the early warm weather, everyone is excited to see this adventure finalized; it is astonishing to realize that what once was a three-bay garage is going to become a state-of-the-art eight-bed facility for our kids. I am confident that as our Therapeutic Residential Program expands, we will be able to house and treat more and more youth in our community.

Previous years have shown that even as we improve and develop our programs, we can still reach for better service to impact our children and families. As we look back on 2019, we are proud of our achieve-

ments, knowing that we are aiming to do even more in the upcoming years. Thank you for helping us achieve our goals. Without you, we wouldn't be able to live out our mission, "answering God's call to love and serve those in need," by dedicating ourselves to believing in youth and providing programs to strengthen families and the community.

The Murphy House Therapeutic Residential Care implements best practices in treatment programs. Once a client graduates from the Murphy House, he may be reunified with parents/kinship, enter MSBR In-Home Wraparound Care, receive MSBR Case Aide program service, enter Morning Star Therapeutic Foster Care placement, or receive a combination of all the aftercare program services.

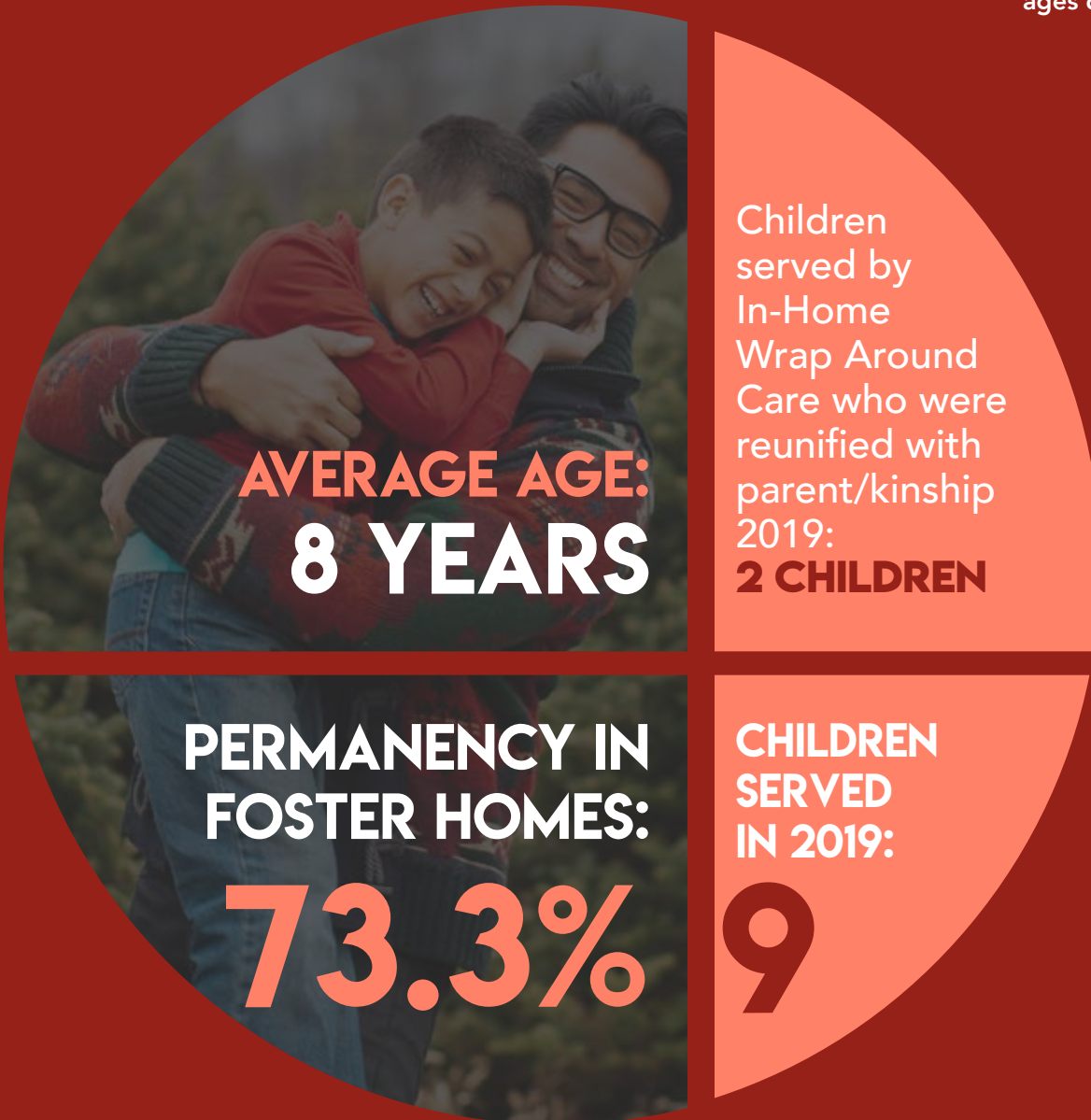
SINCE 2015, THE MORNING STAR CASE AIDE PROGRAM has provided a prevention-based program to our community's children and families who have an identified need for additional stabilization. The program serves all foster youth in the Spokane area regardless of gender from ages 3 to 18+. Through program services such as life-skills mentoring and emotional regulation skills, MSBR Case Aide keeps the foster child in the home while working on preventing homelessness or disruption in placement.

Continuum of Care

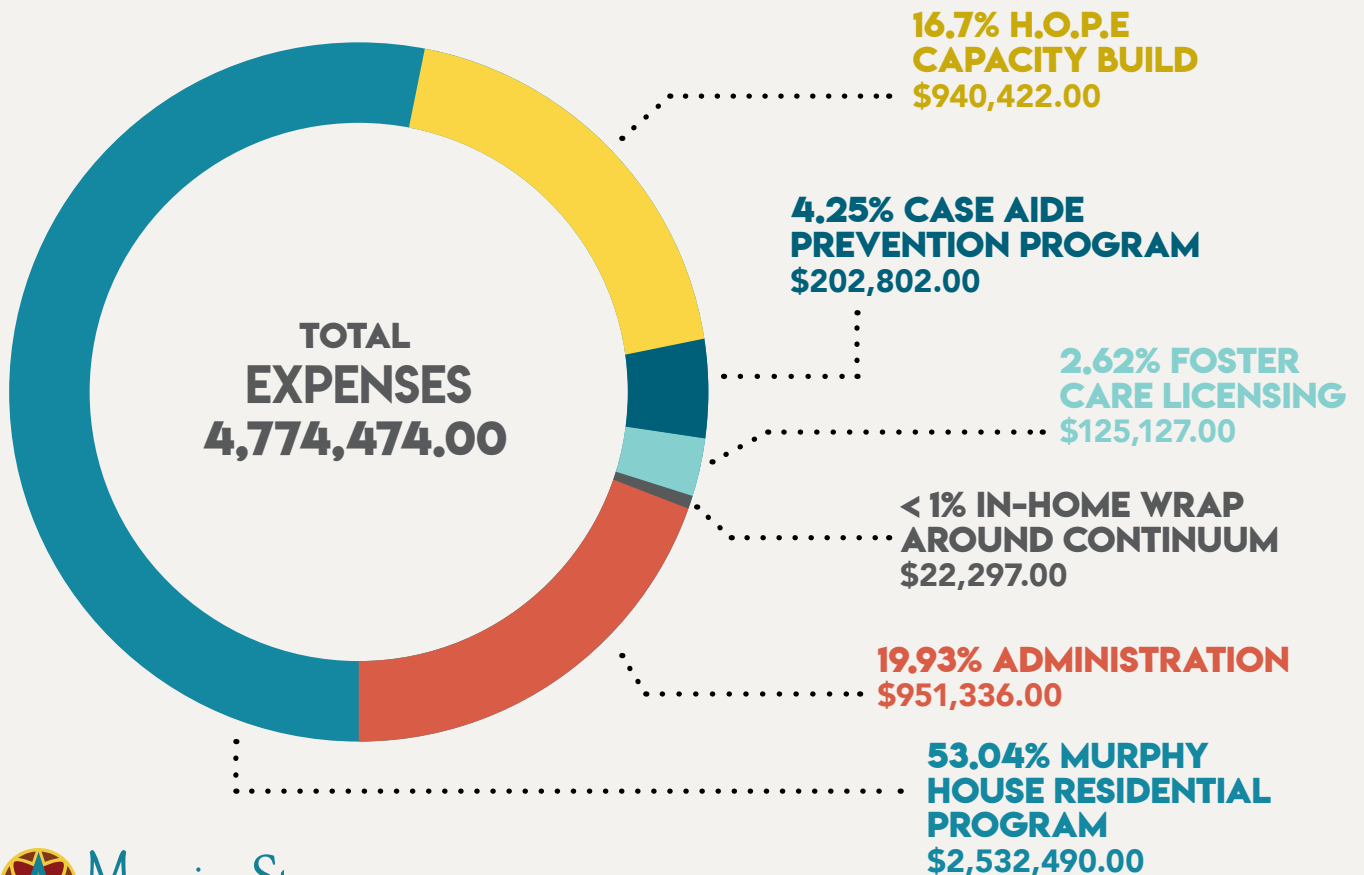
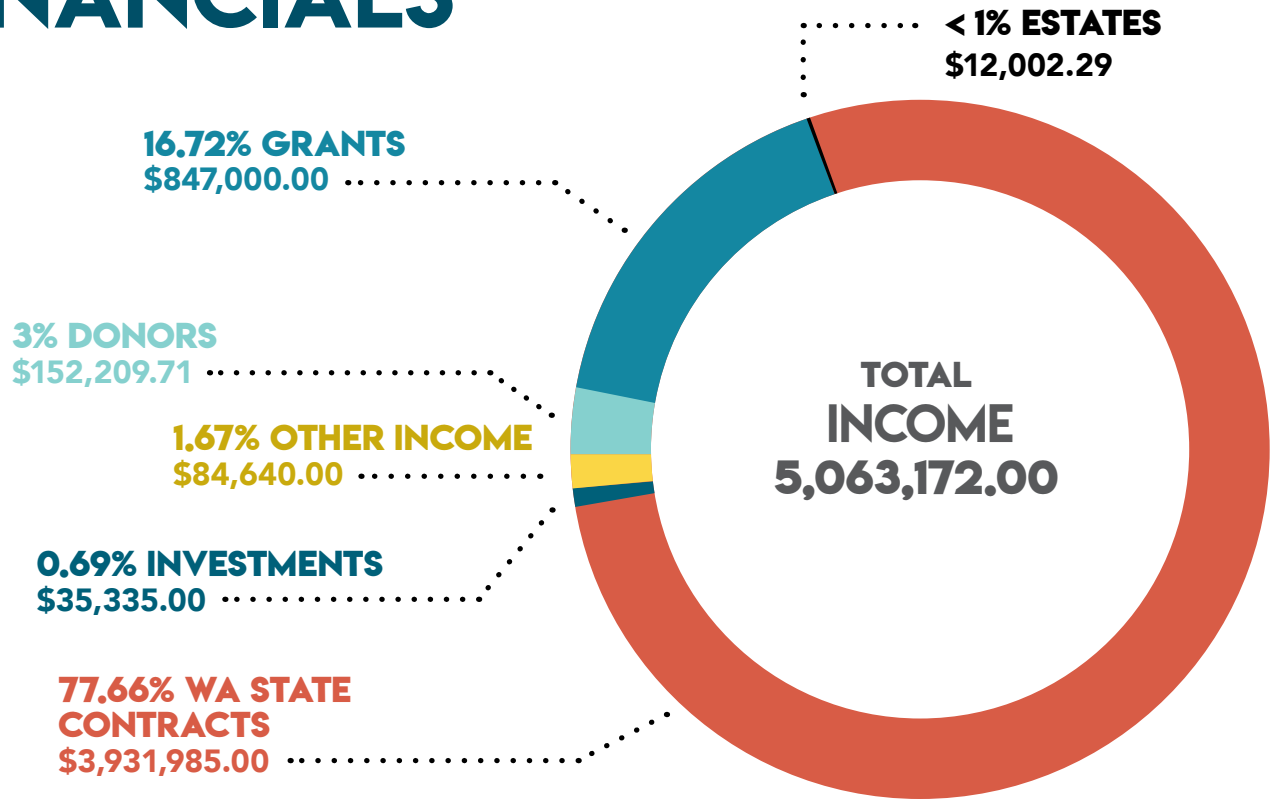

ESTABLISHED IN 2015, the Morning Star In-Home Wrap Around Care program provides support to children who are transitioning to a foster care home or who are being reunified with parents/kin in the Spokane Region who need additional support. In-Home Wrap Around care's goal is to provide a continuum of care that gives additional stabilization within the foster home. Services such as parent training, case management, in-home case aide, family therapy, life skills mentoring, overnight respite, equine program, and 24 hour on-call crisis intervention all help to sustain the work needed to create a more stable environment for these young children.
